SACRAMENTS

Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law #515*). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

After Hours Sick Calls: In case of serious illness after hours, please call 803-493-1714 and leave a message.



Stewardship Reflection on Lectionary Readings — April 12, 2020
Easter Sunday — The Resurrection of the Lord

The great feast of Easter has begun, Christian stewards. Let us rejoice and be glad! Just as we embraced the discipline and fasting of Lent, let us fully embrace the joy and feasting that the next 50 days offer. We are called to be good stewards of the Easter season.

Our first reading, from Acts, gives instruction on how to do this. Here, St. Peter says that our Lord, “commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead... that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name.” How do we ordinary people preach and testify to all that God has done? By the way we live our ordinary lives — through the intentional use of our time, talents and treasure for the kingdom of God. Putting God and others ahead of ourselves in every aspect of our lives is the most eloquent preaching we can do. Boldly and joyfully embracing a stewardship way of life is our most powerful testimony.



Reflecting on today’s Gospel passage from John and studying the actions of the first witnesses to the Resurrection gives us further insight on how we should live the Easter season.

First, we learn of Mary Magdalene’s response. She “came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark.” Despite the trauma of just having witnessed the crucifixion of the Lord Whom she loved so much, Mary Magdalene remained focused on Him, not on herself and her own sense of loss. In fact, forgetting herself entirely, she made her way to the tomb in the dark so she could be near to Him. Once she realized that the tomb was empty we read that she “ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple...” to tell them this shocking news. In response we read that “they both ran, but the other disciple ran faster and arrived at the tomb first.”

They ran to see all of this for themselves. These first witnesses of Christ’s mission and message, His death, and now His Resurrection were passionate. As stewards, we are called to this same devotion to our Lord, this same passion and the same determination to remain near to Him no matter what.

This will look different depending on our own circumstances. Perhaps it will mean committing to a weekday Mass throughout the Easter season to rejoice in all that the Lord has done for us through His death and Resurrection. Perhaps it will mean getting up “in the dark” of the early morning to reflect on the daily Gospel. Perhaps we will gather our courage and finally speak to that friend or co-worker about what the Lord means to us and how they can have His grace in their lives, too. Maybe we will be inspired to host an Easter feast for friends and neighbors at some point during the next 50 days of celebration.

As Christian stewards, we are the modern-day witnesses of an incredible miracle prompted by unfathomable love — the death and Resurrection of our Savior for us. Let us rejoice and be glad, and let’s make sure our lives are a testimony to this amazing grace!

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Peter is an eyewitness: The Lord is risen. (Acts 10:34a, 37-43)

Psalm — “this is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.” (Psalm 118)

Second Reading — All who are baptized, set your hearts in heaven. (Colossians 3:1-4)

Gospel — Three witnesses, Mary, Peter, and John, respond to the empty tomb. (John 20:1-9)

Thursday, April 9th - The Lord's Supper

We began our celebration of the Easter Triduum - the three days that form the climax of Jesus' life on earth. Knowing that he is about to die, Jesus takes the opportunity at the Last Supper not only to tell the disciples what to do in the future, but to show them. As we celebrate together this evening, let us reflect on how we can become better disciples by serving others, washing one another's feet as Jesus did.

Friday, April 10th - The Passion of the Lord

On this central day of this holy Triduum, we remember Jesus' suffering and death. John's account of the Passion does not spare the listener the details of the abuse Jesus endured, but it also emphasizes his acceptance of the Crucifixion knowing the redemptive power of his death. That same tension is seen in Isaiah's narrative about God's faithful servant who submits to horrifying persecution to accomplish God's will. This kind of willing endurance enables the writer of Hebrews to attest that Jesus was similarly tested in every way but suffered obediently. Thankful for the redemption Jesus won for us, let us listen to God's holy word.

Sunday, April 12 - The Resurrection of the Lord

Alleluia! Sing out with joy for the Easter miracle. The Lord is risen. We have been redeemed. Death no longer has ultimate power over us. We anticipate the day when we too will be raised with Christ. As baptized Christians, we have already been raised up to the luminosity of salvation. “This is the day the Lord has made;” we sing in the responsorial psalm, “let us rejoice and be glad.” Let us be nourished in the Eucharist today so that we may go forth joyfully witnessing to the Resurrection of the Lord.
