Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (Code of Canon Law #515). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church. Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and

time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

We have reopened the church for Masses, Baptisms, and Funerals. We will follow the regular schedule of weekday and weekend Masses. There will be no Communion service on Tuesdays at this time. Confessions can be heard by contacting Fr. Ed for an appointment (803-526-7875).

If you are nervous about attending a weekend Mass due to the number of people, we encourage you to attend a daily Mass. We ask that anyone who is sick to remain home, as should vulnerable and at-risk populations. If you are over 65 years of age and have respiratory issues or are immunocompromised, please stay home. The Bishop has granted dispensation to those who are uncomfortable attending weekend Mass and those who are high risk until further notice.

There are restrictions and regulations that need to be followed to insure everyone's safety. These are safeguards that will be in place:

- The worship spaces are limited to 25% of capacity. Social distancing of six feet of separation is always to be maintained. St. Peter's room and the Parish Life Center are open for seating.
- Every other row will be cordoned off and only family members (same address) may sit closely together.
- Seats will be marked with blue tape and you will be directed to seats by ushers at the weekend Masses.
- There will be markings on the floor to guide you when going up to receive Communion. Communion will be received in the hand only.
- There will be no hymnals or missalettes. You may bring your personal missal or printed readings to church. We ask that you take them home with you at the end of Mass.
- Please wear masks out of respect for those around you. If you do not have a mask, the church will provide masks that should be returned after Mass to be sanitized.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at the entrance. Bathrooms will be available for emergencies only.
- Envelopes and cash offerings may be put in the wooden collection box at the entrance.

Thank you for your cooperation with implementing these safeguards.



Stewardship Reflection on Lectionary Readings — June 7, 2020

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Today we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us that the Holy Trinity is the "central mystery of the Christian faith" (261). The concept of the Tri-une God — Three Persons in one God — is truly a mystery, almost too lofty for us ordinary people to even begin to grasp. Can the truth of the Holy Trinity teach us anything as everyday Christian stewards? Actually, yes!



St. John Paul II described the Holy Trinity is a "Divine Family," a community of Persons Who give themselves completely to each other and Who wishes to share Itself, Its life, with us.

These concepts are at the very heart of the stewardship way of life. As stewards, we too are called to share ourselves and our lives with others. As a stewardship parish, we are called to invite others into our community though the gift of hospitality.

These characteristics of our Triune God — offering Himself to us through intimacy with Him in His Divine life — are made manifest from the earliest passages of Scripture as we see in today's first reading, from the Book of Exodus. Earlier in Exodus, God had already developed a close rela-tionship with Moses. Today we read that, "Having come down in a cloud, the Lord stood with Moses there and proclaimed his name, 'Lord.'" He even goes on to describe Himself as "a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." The God of the universe "comes down" to His people, He tells them His name and He tells them some (wonderful) things about Himself. The Father wants to be known and to give Himself to His people!

Our second reading, from 2 Corinthians, carries this theme even farther, as St. Paul prays that, "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit" will be with all of us. In other words, we are invited in to an ever deepening intimacy with this Divine Family, this community of Persons. We are reminded that this Triune God already dwells within us through our Baptism. This divine intimacy we are offered should motivate us to do as St. Paul in-structs at the beginning of this passage, to "mend [our] ways, encourage one another, agree with one another, live in peace."

Finally, our Gospel passage from John reminds us that the stewardship way of life is nothing more and nothing less than the imitation of our Most Holy Trinity. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes might not perish but might have eternal life." He gave Himself, in the Person of His Son, for love of us. We must love this God back now by giving our-selves, our lives, to Him.

Amazingly, the more we give of ourselves to God in love, the more we will find the "grace of the Lord, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit within us." The God of the universe — this mysterious, Triune God — invites us to an ever-deepening intimacy with Him when we make our lives a loving gift to Him and to others through the stewardship way of life.
