**Baptism**: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law* #515). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church. **Marriage**: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned.

priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

Dear Parishioners,

We will follow the regular schedule of weekday and weekend Masses. Communion services will resume on Tuesday, June 16th. Confessions can be heard by contacting Fr. Ed for an appointment at 803-526-7875.

If you are nervous about attending a weekend Mass due to the number of people, we encourage you to attend a daily Mass. We ask that anyone who is sick to remain home, as should vulnerable and at-risk populations. If you are over 65 years of age and have respiratory issues or are immunocompromised, please stay home. The Bishop has granted dispensation to those who are uncomfortable attending weekend Mass and those who are high risk until further notice.

There are restrictions and regulations that need to be followed to insure everyone's safety. These are safeguards that will be in place:

- The worship spaces are limited to 50% of capacity. Social distancing of six feet of separation is always to be maintained. St. Peter's room and the Parish Life Center are open for seating.
- Every other row will be cordoned off and only family members (same address) may sit closely together.
- Seats will be marked with blue tape and you will be directed to seats by ushers at the weekend Masses.
- There will be markings on the floor to guide you when going up to receive Communion. Communion will be received in the hand only.
- There will be no hymnals or missalettes. You may bring your personal missal or printed readings to church. We ask that you take them home with you at the end of Mass.
- Please wear masks out of respect for those around you. If you do not have a mask, the church will provide masks that should be returned after Mass to be sanitized.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at the entrance. Bathrooms will be available for emergencies only.
- Envelopes and cash offerings may be put in the wooden collection box at the entrance.

Thank you for your cooperation with implementing these safeguards.



#### June 1, 2020

My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, As we continue the gradual resumption of the sacraments, we must do so with the safety of the faithful and our priests foremost in mind. I have issued guidelines to assist parishes in planning the resumption of the Sacrament of Confession.

Private confessions may resume on June 1 at the discretion of your pastor. Confession will still look different in the foreseeable future. Parishes have been advised to move penance into the body of the church or to a similar large area. There should be six feet of space between you and the priest, and the option is always available to celebrate the sacrament anonymously.

Please prepare confessions at home and keep it brief. Given these extraordinary times, there may only be a few minutes to have confessions heard. If you need to speak with a priest for counseling on a particular issue in your life, please make an appointment at a different time outside of the confession setting.

People will be asked to leave the confessional space immediately after absolution, and any penance may be done at home or at a safe distance in another portion of your church. All of this will be at your pastor's discretion.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate these new ways of ensuring the faithful receive the sacraments. My prayers are with you all. In the Lord's Peace, Most Rev. Robert E. Guglielmone Bishop of Charleston
