SACRAMENTS

Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law #515*). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

After Hours Sick Calls: In case of serious illness after hours, please call 803-493-1714 and leave a message.

Dear Parishioners,

We will follow the regular schedule of weekday and weekend Masses. Communion services will be on Tuesdays. Confessions can be heard on Saturdays from 4:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.

If you are nervous about attending a weekend Mass due to the number of people, we encourage you to attend a daily Mass. We ask that anyone who is sick to remain home, as should vulnerable and at-risk populations. If you are over 65 years of age and have respiratory issues or are immunocompromised, please stay home. The Bishop has granted dispensation to those who are uncomfortable attending weekend Mass and those who are high risk until further notice.

There are restrictions and regulations that need to be followed to insure everyone's safety. These are safeguards that will be in place:

- The worship spaces are limited to 50% of capacity. Social distancing of six feet of separation is always to be maintained.
 St. Peter's room and the Parish Life Center are open for seating.
- Every other row will be cordoned off and only family members (same address) may sit closely together.
- Seats will be marked with blue tape and you will be directed to seats by ushers at the weekend Masses.
- There will be markings on the floor to guide you when going up to receive Communion.
 Communion will be received in the hand only.
- There will be no hymnals or missalettes. You
 may bring your personal missal or printed
 readings to church. We ask that you take them
 home with you at the end of Mass.
- Please wear masks out of respect for those around you. If you do not have a mask, the church will provide masks that should be returned after Mass to be sanitized.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at the entrance.
 Bathrooms will be available for emergencies only.
- Envelopes and cash offerings may be put in the wooden collection box at the entrance.

Thank you for your cooperation with implementing these safeguards.

All Saints Safety Team Ministry

We would like to take this opportunity to communicate information pertaining to our medical response team. Presently, there are five members who are professional medical and/or medically trained volunteers. Having these individuals as team members allows for medical coverage at each of the weekend Masses. The medical team is a ministry whose mission is to provide medical care to clergy, staff, parishioners and guests who may require it while on the grounds until emergency medical personnel arrive or care is no longer needed. This ministry also includes conducting primary assessments of medical emergency situations, performing triage in the event of a mass casualty event, and remaining in charge of a medical emergency situation until appropriate emergency personnel arrive.

If you have any questions regarding medical services or are aware of someone in need of medical attention while on All Saints Church property, please contact anyone of our team members wearing a round lapel pin (white outline with knight in armor in center).

Stewardship Reflection on Lectionary Readings — July 26, 2020

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The stewardship way of life could be described as a daily pursuit of the kingdom of heaven. Today's readings show us the critical importance of recognizing the kingdom of heaven in our midst and prioritizing our lives in order to obtain it.



In our First Reading, from the First Book of Kings, God appears to Solomon in a dream and invites Solomon to ask Him for something he desires. Rather than asking for riches or power, Solomon asks for the gift of "an understanding heart... to distinguish right from wrong." In other words, he asks God to help him discern what is true and therefore what really matters in life. It is no surprise that God is pleased to give him this gift and that Solomon has been known since then as the wisest of kings. God will give the same gift to us if we ask Him sincerely. And in fact, we must have a wise and understanding heart if we are to live the stewardship way of life, to guide our priorities and decision making in matters big and small.

When we pursue Godly — rather than worldly — priorities, we can do so with great peace because, as St. Paul reminds us in the Second Reading, from Romans, "all things work for good for those who love God and are called according to his purpose." All things — not just the major, life-altering decisions, but the countless tiny ones we make on a daily basis as we strive to serve the Lord and advance the kingdom of heaven.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew today, we arrive at the conclusion of three weeks of Jesus' teaching on the kingdom of heaven. In the first of today's parables, our Lord reminds us that living for Him and for His kingdom will be costly. But the deep joy that comes in following Him makes the "price" entailed worth it. Jesus says, "The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." Next, He says the kingdom of heaven is "like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all that he has and buys it."

In each of these stories, the kingdom of heaven is somewhat "hidden." We must intentionally search for it amidst the noise of the world that bombards us. We need wisdom to recognize it. Yet, our Lord reminds us that His kingdom is meant for everyone and He wants us to find it! He says, "It is like a net thrown into the sea which collects fish of every kind."

But Jesus concludes His teaching with a rather ominous image, reminding us that every "fish" will also be judged as good or bad. "The angels will go out and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth." This is a description that is difficult to forget. Clearly Jesus wants to get our attention.

Let us pray for the wisdom to recognize the kingdom of heaven in our midst and intensify our efforts to pursue it starting right now. There is no time to lose, and we will obtain the immeasurable joy that only comes when we live as disciples of Jesus.


