Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (Code of Canon Law #515). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church. Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned

priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

TODAY'S READINGS



ALL SAINTS SAFETY TEAM MINISTRY

Our Security Team consists of nine members serving as Security Officers. This ministry requires a valid South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED) License, qualification and acceptance by KDI Protective Services and the All Saints Safety Team Steering Committee. Without acceptance and certification by all three, an individual will not be permitted for armed protection of clergy, staff, parishioners, and guests on All Saints Church property.

Under S.C. Code, it is unlawful for a person to possess a firearm of any kind on any premises or property owned, operated, or controlled by a private or public school, church, or any publicly owned building, without the express permission of the authorities in charge of the property. A person who violates the provision of this section may be guilty of a felony upon conviction. At All Saints any person having a conceal carry weapons permit (CCWP) would be in violation of this Code other than a security team officer. The weapon should remain inside your locked motor vehicle while on church property.

We continue to ask for your support and cooperation at certain times and events. As requested in prior communications, we ask that no large bags or backpacks be brought into church. Please cooperate with security as a search of the contents may be requested. If you should see someone in need of medical attention or see suspicious activity, please contact anyone of our team members wearing a round lapel pin (white outline with a knight in armor in the center) immediately. A safety team member is usually at the church main entrance for major parish events.

If you have an interest in joining one of our Safety Team ministries (medical, safety, or security), please contact any of our team members before or after Mass. Past experience is preferred, but not necessary,

as training will be provided to the extent required.



Stewardship Bulletin Reflection October 18, 2020 — Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings encourage us as Christian stewards to always be mindful of who we are and Whose we are in every aspect of our lives.



Jesus reminds us of this truth in our Gospel passage today as He cleverly puts the Pharisees in their place during their attempt to verbally entrap Him. They ask Him whether it is lawful to pay the tax to Caesar. But the Pharisees were thinking small. Christ, on the other hand, thinks big.

We all know how the story goes. Christ asks to see the coin that pays the tax and has them state whose image is on it. They of course, reply, "Caesar." In response Christ tells them to "Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

With that, He reminds us that while civil authorities should be obeyed, we answer to an infinitely higher authority, God, Who is Lord of everything and everyone. All things and all people were created by God. In Baptism we have been claimed for Christ. Our lives are a gift from God and we have the privilege and responsibility to use every aspect of our lives in grateful response to Him.

Let us joyfully give thanks to this wonderful God by the way we live our daily lives. We belong to Him and there is no other!
