**Baptism**: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law* #515). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church. **Marriage**: Couples planning to be married must see a

priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

After Hours Sick Calls: In case of serious illness after hours, please call 803-493-1714 and leave a message.

#### **TODAY'S READINGS**

First Reading — Water flowed from the rock to quench the people's thirst. (Exodus 17:3-7) Psalm - "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." (Psalm 95) Second Reading — The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. (Romans 5:1-2, 5-8) Gospel — The water that I shall give will become a spring of eternal life. (John 4:5-42)

Today we hear readings that focus on water and its ability to satisfy our physical and spiritual thirst. God provided water in the desert to the Chosen People, a miraculous event that slaked their thirst and revealed the Lord's presence. Saint Paul alludes to the promises we made at baptism, which we specifically renew at Easter, that declare our faith, which saves us. In the Gospel, Jesus offers the Samaritan woman water that will bring eternal life. May God's word satisfy our thirst.
