Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (*Code of Canon Law #515*). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

After Hours Sick Calls: In case of serious illness after hours, please call 803-493-1714 and leave a message.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading - The Suffering Servant speaks to the weary. (Isaiah 50:4-7)

Psalm 22 - "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?"

Second Reading - Jesus emptied himself, and accepted death on a cross. (Philippians 2:6-11) Gospel - They came to a place called Golgotha and crucified Jesus there. (Matthew 26:14-27:66)

We greet the Lord today with palm branches and hosannas, welcoming him to the holy city of Jerusalem. His missionary journey and our Lenten journey are nearing their completion. Soon Jesus will celebrate the Passover with his closest disciples here in the center of the Jewish world. Before the sun rises, he will be betrayed by one of his friends, arrested, and taken away. He will be tortured, put on trial, and sentenced to death. He will die on the cross, be taken down, and be buried. From there he will be raised and will ascend to the holy city that is our eternal home. Today, as we shout our hosannas and wave our palm branches to welcome our Lord into Jerusalem, we look forward to the day when we will all be welcomed into the new Jerusalem.

FOOD DRIVE



The All Saints Council of the Knights of Columbus is sponsoring a food drive as part of their Food for Families Program. This month the Clover Area Assistance Center (CAAC) is in need of: canned meats (tuna, chicken, salmon, spam, ham), instant potatoes (boxed or bagged), flavored boxed potatoes (scalloped, Au gratin), canned greens (i.e., collards, turnip, spinach), canned vegetables (beets, asparagus, cabbage, mixed veggies), canned beans (cannellini, navy, black eyed peas, kidney and pinto), canned tomato products (stewed, crushed, whole, Manwich sauce), boxed stuffing, canned pork and beans, beanie weenies, instant brown rice, pasta, ramen noodles, macaroni and cheese, condiments (ketchup, mustard, mayo), soft breakfast bars, soft granola bars, jelly, toilet paper, and dish soap. PLEASE NO CANNED CORN or GREEN BEANS. These will be distributed to needy families in our community. Please take all food items for FOOD FOR FAMILIES to the main kitchen. Collection will take place this weekend. We collected 548 lbs. of food last month. The next food drive will be the weekend of May 6th and 7th.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

We will carpool from All Saints that morning, arrangements will be made once we have numbers.

Our Journey of Faith reservation, inside the library, is a self-guided tour through the life and ministry of Mr. Graham. This tour takes about an hour and a half to complete.

Lunch: There is a Cafe on site for us to have lunch. They have a nice selection of sandwiches and salads, and it looks like we could eat at a cost less than or right at \$15.00 each.

Additional tours: After lunch we could see the following which are also on the library grounds: Graham Family Home, where Billy lived from age 9 to college.

The Memorial Prayer Garden, where Billy Graham and Ruth Bell Graham are buried and Ruth's Attic Bookstore. These are all self-guided tours that may take another hour or two. Billy Graham has a wonderful website that can answer any questions you may have.

We begin this Holy Week with the reading of the Lord's Passion from the Gospel of Matthew. It is fitting that we Christian stewards focus our minds and hearts intensely this week on the steps of our Brother and Savior as He laid down His very life for us.

Before we do so, let us first take a moment to examine the seemingly small acts of stewardship by some who encountered Jesus during this most eventful week.

One occurred when Jesus gave instructions to the disciples about the room where they would celebrate the Passover. Jesus said, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him, "the teacher says... "In your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples." We do not know this man's name but we do know that he agreed to this request — he shared the material gift of his home and the gift of hospitality so that Jesus had a place to celebrate the Passover. Little did he know that because of his good stewardship, his own home would be the site of the institution of the Eucharist!

There was also Simon the Cyrenian who offered the gift of his physical strength, helping the Lord to carry His Cross. Privilege of privileges!

Consider, too, the actions of Joseph of Arimathea — he generously shared a material gift of the tomb that was his, and he gave the gift of service to our Lord by giving Him a proper burial.

Each of these were simple acts of good stewardship, yet God used them in mighty ways. God invites each of us, too, to cooperate with Him in small ways through the sharing of our time, talents and material gifts. Small gifts can become mighty deeds when placed in God's service.




