Baptism: The celebration of Baptism is a moment of Grace for those to be baptized, for their families, and for the entire Parish Community. Preparation class is held the last Wednesday of each month at 7pm. Please call the office to RSVP. A Parish is a certain community of the Christian faithful stably constituted in a particular church, whose pastoral care is entrusted to a pastor (Code of Canon Law #515). Therefore, it is important for parishioners to register for contact and pastoral reasons. You must have a sponsor letter from the parish in which each of the godparents reside. A godparent must have received the sacraments of Baptism, Penance, Holy Communion and, if married, have been married in the Catholic Church. Marriage: Couples planning to be married must see a priest at least six months prior to the planned marriage. Couples seeking to be married at All Saints need to fulfill the All Saints pre-marriage process. The Wedding Coordinator and/or the Pastor will provide the couple with the guidelines and secure the date and

time of the wedding. Do not set a date in advance until you have spoken to the pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office if you or a member of your family need the Sacrament of Anointing.

On behalf of the Wholistic Ministry, we would like to thank all those who so generously provided food for the Ukrainian Refugees. A young Ukrainian-American family has taken on this enormous responsibility in bringing several families to safety in our country. They told me that the families would not be in safe and hospitable surroundings if it was not for the people in our parish. All together there are 6 adults and 5 children. All the adults have jobs and the children are attending school. Two of the children are enrolled in advanced swimming classes and one of the teenage girls is ranked #1 top tennis player representing Clover high school. Two of the kids have skipped a grade because of their outstanding academic records. Learning English is a priority for the adults so they can advance in their jobs to similar professional positions they held in Ukraine. Food continues to be their primary need. The following items should be considered: pasta, rice, tomato sauces, canned tuna, canned chicken, olive oil, pancake syrup, coffee, nutella, granola bars, paper towels, toilet paper, napkins, and Tide soap. Walmart gift cards are nice because they work there and receive a 10% discount when using them. The cards can be left in an envelope in the office.
